2) Both camping and day-use visitation has been strong through the 2022 season thus far. It appears that our visitation numbers have dropped from pandemic times and are more consistent with our visitation pre-COVID.

We are seeing an increase in winter visitation, most significantly our day-use visitors. It appears that more people are now visiting in the winter to go cross-country skiing and snowshoeing.

- 3) Significant Achievements in 2022:
 - Added (2) new wooden tent platforms to campsite cluster #9 and cluster #2
 - Replaced the privy at campsite 5 with a new cedar style building
 - Replaced two split log foot bridges on the Little Salmon Lake Loop
 - Repairs to the Arab Gorge boardwalk
 - Construction of the Outdoor Classroom
 - Addition of interpretive elements outside the Outdoor Classroom (educational displays)
 - Extensive tree removal from storm damage
 - Replacement of several fire grills on campsites
- 4) Some Research initiatives in 2022:
 - MNRF Broad scale monitoring of Little Clear Lake (overall lake health)
 - Frontenac Bird Studies (species monitoring and assessment)
 - Ontario Breeding Bird Atlas updates
 - Influence of environmental change on zooplankton communities (Queens University)
 - Park staff continue to try to manage invasive species within the park. Our main focus was on Dog Strangling Vine again in 2022.
